## *Buy* and *rent* property market

- According to Danos International Property Consultants and Valuers' data, renting a one-bedroom flat in Limassol costs a minimum of €850 a month, while a two-bedroom flat would set back the family budget by at least €1,300.
- Penting a three-bedroom flat in the district is next to impossible on a Cypriot wage, as rents are around €1,700 monthly.
- According to recent CyStat data Cypriots' average gross monthly earnings rose to €2,693 for the fourth quarter of 2024, from €2,535 in the preceding year, reflecting a noteworthy 6.2 per cent increase.
- Seasonally adjusted figures for the same period reveal that the average gross monthly earnings stood at €2,402, a 1.6 per cent increase compared to the third quarter of 2024.
- CyStat data also points out that more than half of the island's employees take home an average of €1,500. The minimum monthly wage in Cyprus is set at €1000.
- In Nicosia, the rent price for a one-bedroom flat is between €550 and €650, while a two-bedroom flat would set a family back a minimum of €750.
- Parting in an 85 square metre flat in an uptown area of the capital, like Engomi, costs €900 monthly.
- The rent for a three-bedroom flat in the capital is between €950 and €1500.
- Nicosia residents looking for cheaper alternatives must move to the suburbs, such as Lakatamia, where rents are lower.
- Rents in Larnaca and Paphos are lower, but likely only for the moment, as the interest of foreign investors and high-tech companies on the lookout for a Cyprus base in the coastal towns is on the rise.
- The rent for a one-bedroom is between €450 and €550.
- Two-bedroom flats are €550 to €650, while the rent of a three-bedroom is €750 to €850. Prices mentioned are indicative, and subject to the property's location, age and other characteristics.

## Paphos schools



#### Public Schools

Public schools in Cyprus are free and available to absolutely every child over 6 years old. It is known that the Cypriot government invests well in education, approximately 8% of GDP. Thus, highly qualified teachers work in schools.

Upon graduation, children enter local and foreign universities. Some families first choose Greek primary schools, and then private English high schools.

#### English schools

English schools have kindergartens, where children are taught not only the basics of the language, but also reading, arithmetic, and even a bit of science. The annual cost of education in a private English school varies from 3.5 thousand euros in kindergarten to 8 thousand euros in high school. As a rule, payment is made in several stages, and discounts of 5-10% are sometimes promised for paying the full amount within one transfer.

#### Aspire Private British School

In Kato Paphos, not far from the famous Tombs of the Kings, there is another well-known state-accredited school - the Aspire British Academy, where the training program is built on the classic British model. Graduates receive a certificate of secondary education in the English program, and even a local Apolytirion certificate.

#### TLC Private School

Some families living in Peyia, far from the center, prefer TLC Private School. The school is small, but the construction of a new additional building has already begun. It is expected to be completed in 2 years.

The school is only 13 years old, but it is developing rapidly and thanks to this it is very popular both among locals and among foreigners. Children from 3 to 18 years old study here, from kindergarten to Sixth Form classes. For the convenience of parents, a transfer from home to school is organized.


The Sixth Form High School is the flagship of the TLC school community. It is made up of students who have obtained at least B grades in the IGCSE exams or who have come from other schools to complete an A level qualification before continuing their studies at universities in the UK, Europe and around the world. Along with A levels, students can also earn additional IGCSE qualifications or expand their education by studying in an Apolytirion course or completing BTEC practical qualifications.

## The International School of Paphos Private (ISOP)

The largest and most popular private school in Paphos, ISOP, was founded in 1987. It is located on Aristoteli Savva street, close to Makariou Avenue. The nearest areas are Mesa Chorio, Tala, Chloraka and Kannaviou.

The International School operates at the British Embassy. After the successful completion of the program, students are issued a state-recognized certificate. To enter, the child takes an entrance test in English and mathematics.

ISOP is also a boarding school. It offers a modern international environment for the child. The professional team is here to help children prepare for the challenges they face both in and out of the classroom. The community today has up to 70 girls and boys aged 11 to 18, some of whom live in the school 7 days a week, while others go home on weekends.



# Paphos - the University small city of Cyprus

#### American University of Paphos

The agreement between the municipality of Paphos and Lebanon's AUB for the establishment of the American University of Beirut-Mediterraneo in Cyprus was signed on April 8, 2022. Architectural plans for the university show that it will operate out of the complex of the old Carob Mills on Apostols Pavlos Avenue and cover 10,000 square metres. A government owned plot of land of around 7,000 square metres has been donated. The American University of Beirut-Mediterraneo will operate according to American standards. In the first phase, three fields of study will be covered: computer science, economics and business and civil engineering, with the aim of accommodating over 2,000 students in the coming years.

#### TEPAK

The students of the Cyprus University of Technology (TEPAK) at the school of the academic institution that began operating this year in Paphos are set to increase and surpass 600 in the new academic year. the Department of Hospitality and Tourism Management, the Department of Management, Entrepreneurship and Digital Business, as well as the Academy of Hospitality and Tourism opened their doors. The Faculty's students in the academic year 2023-2024 include the first-year students admitted to the Faculty's undergraduate programmes of study (Degree in Hotel Management and Tourism and Degree in Management) and all the students enrolled in the three-year programmes of study of the Academy of Hospitality and Tourism (Culinary Arts and Hotel and Tourism Management). The TEPAK currently hosts a total of 300 students and this number is expected to gradually increase to 1,000.

Paphos is known for its rich history and has been inhabited since ancient times. The city is home to numerous archaeological sites, including the UNESCO World Heritage site of Paphos Archaeological Park, where visitors can explore ancient ruins, including Roman villas with well-preserved mosaics.

## Paphos has been named the most liveable small city in the world by Compare the Market AU.

The report assessed seven factors: the number of restaurants, entertainment options, unemployment rate, number of rainy days, health index score, safety score and overall cost of goods. Paphos ranked first with a score of 5.495 out of 7. The top three best small cities were rounded out by Arrecife in Spain and Trapani in Italy. Two Greek cities, loannina and Xanthi, also made the global ranking, securing 22nd and 44th spots respectively. European cities dominated the list, with Grande Prairie in Canada being the only non-European city to break into the top ten with a score of 4.295.


